5. APPROVAL OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH STANTEC CONSULTING SERVICES, INC. FOR CONSENT DECREE IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025/26: The San Bernardino Municipal Water Department (Department) has utilized the services of Mark Eisen with Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. (Stantec) for Consent Decree related support services. The Department desires to execute a new Professional Services Agreement with Stantec to provide services from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

The total estimated cost for Task Orders 1, 2, and 3 is \$308,029.00. The Department has sufficient funds budgeted in the Fiscal Year 2025/26 Operation Budget to cover these professional services (Account No. 103010-5201). Task Orders 1 and 2 are 100 percent reimbursable through the AIG commutation account. Task Order 3 is 100 percent reimbursed through the PFM account.

6. CONTRACT NO. 1811 – RE CHAFFEE CONSTRUCTION, INC. – CHANGE ORDER NO. 2 – VERDEMONT 2300 PZ EAST WATER FACILITIES PROJECT (PROJECT NO. C1710828): On November 14, 2024, the Water Board approved Contract No. 1811 with RE Chaffee Construction, Inc. (RE Chaffee) for the Verdemont 2300 PZ East Water Facilities Project. The project consists of construction of a 1 MG steel reservoir, 3500 gallons per minute booster station, and approximately 2900 feet of various sized ductile iron pipe.

Upon excavation, the Contractor encountered several issues, including:

- Excess rock which required breaking prior to removal
- Re-routing of surge anticipator line
- Incorrect elevation and slope callout
- Extension of existing vault walls
- Additional fire hydrant installation
- Installation of protective riprap pad

Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$98,525.96 has been prepared for this extra work to be performed by RE Chaffee under Contract No. 1811.

The funding source for this project is the FY 2025/2026 Water Fund Capital Improvement Project titled 2300 Zone 1 MG Reservoir (Project No. C1710828) which currently has a total of \$326,109.13 in unencumbered funds.

7. PROPERTY INSURANCE RENEWAL – FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2025/2026: On July 31, 2025, the Department will need to renew its property insurance coverage for fiscal year 2025/26, covering approximately \$532,159,976 in water, wastewater treatment, and sewer collection system real and personal property.

The annual premium for \$400 million of property coverage has been quoted at \$1,087,817, which is an increase in total costs of approximately 1.4% over fiscal year 2024/2025. The first excess layer coverage policy for earthquake and flood insurance is at a cost of \$155, 880, and the second excess coverage policy for earthquake and flood risks premium is at a cost of \$52,690.

Overall, the premiums for property, earthquake, and flood insurance for this fiscal year are 0.67% lower than last fiscal year premiums. There are adequate budgeted funds to cover the new costs.

Funds have been budgeted in fiscal year 2025/26 to insure \$400,000,000 in property, with \$25,000,000 in earthquake and flood hazard coverage.

Water Department staff continue to work with Marsh Risk & Insurance Services (Marsh) to find the most appropriate insurance coverage strategy for Department-owned property. Marsh requested coverage quotes from insurers based on the Department's overall asset values and claim history.

## **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

5. APPROVAL OF SOFTWARE AS A SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH TYLER TECHNOLOGIES, INC. FOR ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING SYSTEMS CLOUD HOSTED SERVICES: The City of San Bernardino Municipal Water Department (Department) has utilized Tyler Technologies, Inc. (Tyler) on premise software as the Department's Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system. This software encompassed financial management, purchasing, accounts payable, and people management (Human Resources and Payroll). Continuous updates to hardware, database licensing, and operating systems were essential to keep the system functioning properly.

Tyler recently provided the Department with a quote to transition the ERP applications to a cloud hosted Software as a Service environment. The transition from on-premise to a cloud environment would allow Tyler to manage our application data, free up Department server space, and replace recurring maintenance fees. The goal of the transition was to manage the system while taking advantage of newer technology and reduce manual processes while increasing productivity.

The funding source for this Agreement was the FY 2025/2026 budget in Section 1040 – Information Technology, Account No. 101040-5602 - *Software Maintenance*, which had a total of \$1.2 million in unencumbered funds. There were sufficient funds available to fund this Agreement.

Commissioner Brickley asked if this amount was a one-time fee for this upgrade.

Director Mouser stated that this amount is for one (1) year and would replace the maintenance fee.

Director Mouser stated the upgrade would be charged annually, but that this would benefit the Department and our Information Technology section because it would make it easier to troubleshoot issues quicker than how it is set up currently.

Commissioner Brickley asked what the length of the contract was for this agreement.

Director Mouser stated that the Department would contract with Tyler annually, as long as the Department owned the software.

6. 2025 STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE: In 2019, the Department embarked in a strategic planning effort with the goal to update its mission statement and key value statements and adopt a strategic plan that represented the Water Board's vision for the Department's future direction. On August 13, 2019, the Board adopted the revised Mission and Key Value Statements and the Department's Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan included 5 Guiding Targets, 14 Goals that fell within the Targets, and an Action Plan with 100 specific actions aimed at meeting the Targets and Goals.

It has been best practice to conduct a thorough review and update of a strategic plan every 3-5 years. However, ongoing review/maintenance of an action plan was necessary to ensure it was current and properly executed. On September 22, 2020, the first Strategic Plan update was approved by the Water Board. The focus was on the Action Plan, which resulted in a net 77 actions completed and 6 new actions.

Staff again worked diligently and at the 2021 Strategic Plan update there were 17 actions completed, 12 actions remaining on schedule and 35 "ongoing" actions with meaningful progress made as time progressed. All actions were eventually completed leaving only "ongoing" actions such as continuing recruitment and retention efforts through outreach or ongoing capital project completions.

The foundation had been laid and executed from 2019 through 2024, and the Strategic Plan now needed to reflect a broader perspective to guide policy, set

objectives and prioritize investments to ensure efficient operations, ongoing community engagement and integration of sustainable water management practices.

There was no direct fiscal impact. The Department's typical funding approval practices would apply as necessary.

General Manager Guerrero gave a presentation on the Strategic Plan Update to the Water Board.

President Callicott asked when the first Strategic Plan was approved.

General Manager Guerrero stated that the Strategic Plan was approved in August 2019.

Commissioner Brickley asked where the goals and action plans for the individual sections in the Department were listed in the new Strategic Plan Update.

General Manager Guerrero stated that the Department was going to approach goals and action plans differently by focusing on the goals and accomplishments through the budget process.

Commissioner Hendrix asked if the Department would highlight the goals and accomplishments in the newsletter.

General Manager Guerrero stated that the Strategic Plan would be highlighted in the newsletter, at community meetings, and to the Mayor and City Council through a Strategic Plan pamphlet.

Commissioner Mlynarski asked Amy Stevens, WSC consultant, what her impression was regarding working with staff and receiving the survey responses.

Amy Stevens stated that this was one of the easiest strategic plans that she has completed and Department staff was very helpful.

Amy Stevens stated that the foundation was solid which made it easy to update the Department's Strategic Plan.

## **BACKGROUND:**

The San Bernardino Municipal Water Department (Department) has utilized the services of Mark Eisen with Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. (Stantec) for Consent Decree-related support services. The Department desires to execute a new Professional Services Agreement with Stantec to provide services from August 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

There are three categories of support services:

Task Order 1 will include project management and data analysis services in connection with the Department, EPA, and DTSC. This task order also includes support services for new shallow wells, rehabilitation of existing Consent Decree wells and demolition of the monitoring well, MW Paperboard.

Task Order 2 will provide assistance to Department staff in preparing the semi-annual progress reports including database management.

Task Order 3 San Bernardino Basin Model (SBBM) will undergo a significant revision and update under the guidance of a steering committee assembled to facilitate a cooperative process of modifying the model to meet the needs of SBMWD, SBVMWD, and SBVWCD. Stantec will be representing SBMWD's interests with respect to the NGCSS.

## **GOALS AND OBJECTIVES:**

This proposed agreement aligns with the Department's Strategic Plan under Goal No. 6: Champion Environmental Compliance and Sustainability. It supports the specific Subgoal No. 6.1: Achieve 100% Regulatory Compliance by providing management and oversight of groundwater clean-up to drinking water standards through the Consent Decree.

# PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN BERNARDINO, THROUGH THE SAN BERNARDINO MUNICIPAL WATER DEPARTMENT, AND STANTEC CONSULTING SERVICES, INC. CONTRACT NO. 1871

This Agreement is made and entered into as of August 1, 2025 by and between the City of San Bernardino, a charter city and municipal corporation organized and operating under the laws of the State of California, through the San Bernardino Municipal Water Department with its principal place of business at 1350 S. "E" Street, San Bernardino, CA 92408 ("City"), and Stantec Consulting Services, Inc., a California Corporation with its principal place of business at 290 Conejo Ridge Avenue, Thousand Oaks, CA 91361 (hereinafter referred to as "Consultant"). City and Consultant are hereinafter sometimes referred to individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

## **RECITALS**

A. City is a public agency of the State of California and is in need of professional services for the following project:

Consent Decree Implementation Support For Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Project (hereinafter referred to as "the Project").

- B. Consultant is duly licensed and has the necessary qualifications to provide such services.
- C. The Parties desire by this Agreement to establish the terms for City to retain Consultant to provide the services described herein.

## **AGREEMENT**

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The recitals above are true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. <u>Services</u>. Consultant shall provide the City with the services described in the Scope of Services attached hereto as Exhibit "A."
- 3. <u>Professional Practices</u>. All professional services to be provided by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by personnel identified in their proposal. Consultant warrants that Consultant is familiar with all laws that may affect its performance of this Agreement and shall advise City of any changes in any laws that may affect Consultant's performance of this Agreement. Consultant further represents that no City employee will provide any services under this Agreement.

## 4. Compensation.

a. Subject to paragraph 4(b) below, the City shall pay for such services in

accordance with the Schedule of Charges set forth in Exhibit "A."

- b. In no event shall the total amount paid for services rendered by Consultant under this Agreement exceed the sum of THREE HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND TWENTY-NINE DOLLARS AND 00/100 DOLLARS (\$308,029.00). This amount is to cover all related costs, and the City will not pay any additional fees for printing expenses. Consultant may electronically submit invoices to City for approval at <a href="water-accounting@sbmwd.org">water-accounting@sbmwd.org</a>. Said invoice shall be based on the total of all Consultant's services which have been completed to City's sole satisfaction. City shall pay Consultant's invoice within forty-five (45) days from the date City receives said invoice at the above referenced e-mail address. The invoice shall describe in detail the services performed and the associated time for completion. Any additional services approved and performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be designated as "Additional Services" and shall identify the number of the authorized change order, where applicable, on all invoices.
- 5. Additional Work. If changes in the work seem merited by Consultant or the City, and informal consultations with the other party indicate that a change is warranted, it shall be processed in the following manner: a letter outlining the changes shall be forwarded to the City by Consultant with a statement of estimated changes in fee or time schedule. An amendment to this Agreement shall be prepared by the City and executed by both Parties before performance of such services, or the City will not be required to pay for the changes in the scope of work. Such amendment shall not render ineffective or invalidate unaffected portions of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on August 1, 2025 and continue through June 30, 2026 as set forth in Exhibit "A," unless the Agreement is previously terminated as provided for herein ("Term").

## 7. <u>Maintenance of Records; Audits.</u>

- a. Records of Consultant's services relating to this Agreement shall be maintained in accordance with generally recognized accounting principles and shall be made available to City for inspection and/or audit at mutually convenient times for a period of four (4) years from the Effective Date.
- b. Books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred shall be maintained by Consultant and made available at all reasonable times during the contract period and for four (4) years from the date of final payment under the contract for inspection by City.
- 8. <u>Time of Performance</u>. Consultant shall perform its services in a prompt and timely manner and shall commence performance upon receipt of written notice from the City to proceed. Consultant shall complete the services required hereunder within Term.

## 9. Delays in Performance.

a. Neither City nor Consultant shall be considered in default of this Agreement for delays in performance caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the non-performing Party. For purposes of this Agreement, such circumstances include but are not limited to, abnormal weather conditions; floods; earthquakes; fire; epidemics; war; riots and other civil

disturbances; strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns, and other labor disturbances; sabotage or judicial restraint.

b. Should such circumstances occur, the non-performing Party shall, within a reasonable time of being prevented from performing, give written notice to the other Party describing the circumstances preventing continued performance and the efforts being made to resume performance of this Agreement.

## 10. <u>Compliance with Law.</u>

- a. Consultant shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, codes and regulations of the federal, state and local government, including Cal/OSHA requirements.
- b. If required, Consultant shall assist the City, as requested, in obtaining and maintaining all permits required of Consultant by federal, state and local regulatory agencies.
- c. If applicable, Consultant is responsible for all costs of clean up and/ or removal of hazardous and toxic substances spilled as a result of his or her services or operations performed under this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Standard of Care</u>. Consultant's services will be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional practices and principles and in a manner consistent with the level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing under similar conditions.
- 12. <u>Conflicts of Interest</u>. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall at all times maintain a duty of loyalty and a fiduciary duty to the City and shall not accept payment from or employment with any person or entity which will constitute a conflict of interest with the City.
- 13. <u>City Business Certificate</u>. Consultant shall, prior to execution of this Agreement, obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement a valid business registration certificate from the City pursuant to Title 5 of the City's Municipal Code and any and all other licenses, permits, qualifications, insurance, and approvals of whatever nature that are legally required of Consultant to practice his/her profession, skill, or business.
- Agreement or any rights under or interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the City, which may be withheld for any reason. Any attempt to so assign or so transfer without such consent shall be void and without legal effect and shall constitute grounds for termination. Subcontracts, if any, shall contain a provision making them subject to all provisions stipulated in this Agreement. Nothing contained herein shall prevent Consultant from employing independent associates and subconsultants as Consultant may deem appropriate to assist in the performance of services hereunder.
  - 15. Independent Consultant. Consultant is retained as an independent contractor and is

not an employee of City. No employee or agent of Consultant shall become an employee of City. The work to be performed shall be in accordance with the work described in this Agreement, subject to such directions and amendments from City as herein provided.

16. <u>Insurance</u>. Consultant shall not commence work for the City until it has provided evidence satisfactory to the City it has secured all insurance required under this section. In addition, Consultant shall not allow any subcontractor to commence work on any subcontract until it has secured all insurance required under this section.

## a. Additional Insured

The City of San Bernardino, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be named as additional insureds on Consultant's and its subconsultants' policies of commercial general liability and automobile liability insurance using the endorsements and forms specified herein or exact equivalents.

## b. <u>Commercial General Liability</u>

- (i) The Consultant shall take out and maintain, during the performance of all work under this Agreement, in amounts not less than specified herein, Commercial General Liability Insurance, in a form and with insurance companies acceptable to the City.
- (ii) Coverage for Commercial General Liability insurance shall be at least as broad as the following:

Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (Occurrence Form CG 00 01) or exact equivalent.

- (iii) Commercial General Liability Insurance must include coverage for the following:
  - (1) Bodily Injury and Property Damage
  - (2) Personal Injury/Advertising Injury
  - (3) Premises/Operations Liability
  - (4) Products/Completed Operations Liability
  - (5) Aggregate Limits that Apply per Project
  - (6) Explosion, Collapse and Underground (UCX) exclusion deleted
  - (7) Contractual Liability with respect to this Contract
  - (8) Broad Form Property Damage
  - (9) Independent Consultants Coverage
- (iv) The policy shall contain no endorsements or provisions limiting coverage for (1) contractual liability; (2) cross liability exclusion for claims or suits by one insured against another; (3) products/completed operations liability; or (4) contain any other exclusion contrary to the Agreement.
  - (v) The policy shall give City, its elected and appointed officials,

officers, employees, agents, and City-designated volunteers additional insured status using ISO endorsement forms CG 20 10 10 01 and 20 37 10 01, or endorsements providing the exact same coverage.

(vi) The general liability program may utilize either deductibles or provide coverage excess of a self-insured retention, subject to written approval by the City, and provided that such deductibles shall not apply to the City as an additional insured.

## c. Automobile Liability

- (i) At all times during the performance of the work under this Agreement, the Consultant shall maintain Automobile Liability Insurance for bodily injury and property damage including coverage for owned, non-owned and hired vehicles, in a form and with insurance companies acceptable to the City.
- (ii) Coverage for automobile liability insurance shall be at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 00 01 covering automobile liability (Coverage Symbol 1, any auto).
- (iii) The policy shall give City, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents and City designated volunteers additional insured status.
- (iv) Subject to written approval by the City, the automobile liability program may utilize deductibles, provided that such deductibles shall not apply to the City as an additional insured, but not a self-insured retention.

## d. Workers' Compensation/Employer's Liability

- (i) Consultant certifies that he/she is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code, which requires every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and he/she will comply with such provisions before commencing work under this Agreement.
- (ii) To the extent Consultant has employees at any time during the term of this Agreement, at all times during the performance of the work under this Agreement, the Consultant shall maintain full compensation insurance for all persons employed directly by him/her to carry out the work contemplated under this Agreement, all in accordance with the "Workers' Compensation and Insurance Act," Division IV of the Labor Code of the State of California and any acts amendatory thereof, and Employer's Liability Coverage in amounts indicated herein. Consultant shall require all subconsultants to obtain and maintain, for the period required by this Agreement, workers' compensation coverage of the same type and limits as specified in this section.

## e. Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions)

At all times during the performance of the work under this Agreement the Consultant shall maintain professional liability or Errors and Omissions insurance appropriate to its profession, in a form and with insurance companies acceptable to the City and in an amount indicated herein. This insurance shall be endorsed to include contractual liability applicable to this Agreement and shall be written on a policy form coverage specifically designed to protect against acts, errors or omissions of the Consultant. "Covered Professional Services" as designated in the policy must specifically include work performed under this Agreement. The policy must "pay on behalf of" the insured and must include a provision establishing the insurer's duty to defend.

## f. Privacy/Network Security (Cyber)

At all times during the performance of the work under this Agreement, the Consultant shall maintain privacy/network security insurance for: (1) privacy breaches, (2) system breaches, (3) denial or loss of service, and the (4) introduction, implantation or spread of malicious software code, in a form and with insurance companies acceptable to the City.

## g. Minimum Policy Limits Required

(i) The following insurance limits are required for the Agreement:

Automobile Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and

omissions)

Cyber Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence and aggregate

- (ii) Defense costs shall be payable in addition to the limits.
- (iii) Requirements of specific coverage or limits contained in this section are not intended as a limitation on coverage, limits, or other requirement, or a waiver of any coverage normally provided by any insurance. Any available coverage shall be provided to the parties required to be named as Additional Insured pursuant to this Agreement.

## h. Evidence Required

Prior to execution of the Agreement, the Consultant shall file with the City evidence of insurance from an insurer or insurers certifying to the coverage of all insurance required herein. Such evidence shall include original copies of the ISO CG 00 01 (or insurer's equivalent) signed by the insurer's representative and Certificate of Insurance (Acord Form 25-S or equivalent), together with required endorsements. All evidence of insurance shall be signed by a properly authorized officer, agent, or qualified representative of the insurer and shall certify the names of the insured, any additional insureds, where appropriate, the type and amount of the insurance, the location and operations to which the insurance applies, and the expiration date of such insurance.

## i. Policy Provisions Required

- (i) Consultant shall provide the City at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of cancellation of any policy required by this Agreement, except that the Consultant shall provide at least ten (10) days prior written notice of cancellation of any such policy due to non-payment of the premium. If any of the required coverage is cancelled or expires during the term of this Agreement, the Consultant shall deliver renewal certificate(s) including the General Liability Additional Insured Endorsement to the City at least ten (10) days prior to the effective date of cancellation or expiration.
- (ii) The Commercial General Liability Policy and Automobile Policy shall each contain a provision stating that Consultant's policy is primary insurance and that any insurance, self-insurance or other coverage maintained by the City or any named insureds shall not be called upon to contribute to any loss.
- (iii) The retroactive date (if any) of each policy is to be no later than the effective date of this Agreement. Consultant shall maintain such coverage continuously for a period of at least three years after the completion of the work under this Agreement. Consultant shall purchase a one (1) year extended reporting period A) if the retroactive date is advanced past the effective date of this Agreement; B) if the policy is cancelled or not renewed; or C) if the policy is replaced by another claims-made policy with a retroactive date subsequent to the effective date of this Agreement.
- (iv) All required insurance coverages, except for the professional liability coverage, shall contain or be endorsed to provide waiver of subrogation in favor of the City, its officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers or shall specifically allow Consultant or others providing insurance evidence in compliance with these specifications to waive their right of recovery prior to a loss. Consultant hereby waives its own right of recovery against City, and shall require similar written express waivers and insurance clauses from each of its subconsultants.
- (v) The limits set forth herein shall apply separately to each insured against whom claims are made or suits are brought, except with respect to the limits of liability. Further, the limits set forth herein shall not be construed to relieve the Consultant from liability in excess of such coverage, nor shall it limit the Consultant's indemnification obligations to the City and shall not preclude the City from taking such other actions available to the City under other provisions of the Agreement or law.

## i. Qualifying Insurers

- (i) All policies required shall be issued by acceptable insurance companies, as determined by the City, which satisfy the following minimum requirements:
  - (1) Each such policy shall be from a company or companies with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII and admitted to transact in the business of insurance in the State of California, or otherwise allowed to place insurance through surplus line brokers under applicable provisions of the California Insurance Code or any federal law.

## j. Additional Insurance Provisions

- (i) The foregoing requirements as to the types and limits of insurance coverage to be maintained by Consultant, and any approval of said insurance by the City, is not intended to and shall not in any manner limit or qualify the liabilities and obligations otherwise assumed by the Consultant pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the provisions concerning indemnification.
- (ii) If at any time during the life of the Agreement, any policy of insurance required under this Agreement does not comply with these specifications or is canceled and not replaced, City has the right but not the duty to obtain the insurance it deems necessary and any premium paid by City will be promptly reimbursed by Consultant or City will withhold amounts sufficient to pay premium from Consultant payments. In the alternative, City may cancel this Agreement.
- (iii) The City may require the Consultant to provide complete copies of all insurance policies in effect for the duration of the Project.
- (iv) Neither the City nor the City Council, nor any member of the City Council, nor any of the elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents or volunteers shall be personally responsible for any liability arising under or by virtue of this Agreement.
- k. <u>Subconsultant Insurance Requirements</u>. Consultant shall not allow any subcontractors or subconsultants to commence work on any subcontract until they have provided evidence satisfactory to the City that they have secured all insurance required under this section. Policies of commercial general liability insurance provided by such subcontractors or subconsultants shall be endorsed to name the City as an additional insured using ISO form CG 20 38 04 13 or an endorsement providing the exact same coverage. If requested by Consultant, City may approve different scopes or minimum limits of insurance for particular subcontractors or subconsultants.

## 17. Indemnification.

a. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall defend (with counsel reasonably approved by the City), indemnify and hold the City, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents, and authorized volunteers free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits, actions, proceedings, costs, expenses, liability, judgments, awards, decrees, settlements, loss, damage or injury of any kind, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death, (collectively, "Claims") in any manner arising out of,

pertaining to, or incident to any alleged acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Consultant, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, consultants or agents in connection with the performance of the Consultant's services, the Project, or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages, expert witness fees and attorneys' fees and other related costs and expenses. Notwithstanding the foregoing, to the extent Consultant's services are subject to Civil Code Section 2782.8, the above indemnity shall be limited, to the extent required by Civil Code Section 2782.8, to Claims that arise out of, pertain to, or relate to the negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct of the Consultant. Consultant's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the City, the City Council, members of the City Council, elected and appointed officials, officers, its employees, or authorized volunteers.

- Additional Indemnity Obligations. Consultant shall defend, with counsel h. of City's choosing and at Consultant's own cost, expense and risk, any and all Claims covered by this section that may be brought or instituted against the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, or authorized volunteers. Consultant shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, or authorized volunteers as part of any such claim, suit, action or other proceeding. Consultant shall also reimburse City for the cost of any settlement paid by the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, or authorized volunteers as part of any such claim, suit, action or other proceeding. Such reimbursement shall include payment for the City's attorney's fees and costs, including expert witness fees. Consultant shall reimburse the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, or authorized volunteers, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided. Consultant's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, or authorized volunteers.
- California Labor Code Requirements. Consultant is aware of the requirements of California Labor Code Sections 1720 et seq. and 1770 et seq., as well as California Code of Regulations, Title 8, Section 16000, et seq., ("Prevailing Wage Laws"), which require the payment of prevailing wage rates and the performance of other requirements on certain "public works" and "maintenance" projects. If the Services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, as defined by the Prevailing Wage Laws, Consultant agrees to fully comply with such Prevailing Wage Laws, if applicable. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from any claims, liabilities, costs, penalties or interest arising out of any failure or alleged failure to comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws. It shall be mandatory upon the Consultant and all subconsultants to comply with all California Labor Code provisions, which include but are not limited to prevailing wages, employment of apprentices, hours of labor and debarment of contractors and subcontractors.

If the Services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, then pursuant to Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1, the Consultant and all subconsultants performing such Services must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. Consultant shall maintain registration for the duration of the Project and require the same of any subconsultants, as applicable. This Project may also be subject to

compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. It shall be Consultant's sole responsibility to comply with all applicable registration and labor compliance requirements.

- 19. <u>Verification of Employment Eligibility</u>. By executing this Agreement, Consultant verifies that it fully complies with all requirements and restrictions of state and federal law respecting the employment of undocumented aliens, including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as may be amended from time to time, and shall require all subconsultants and sub-subconsultants to comply with the same.
- 20. <u>Laws and Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. If any action is brought to interpret or enforce any term of this Agreement, the action shall be brought in a state or federal court situated in the County of San Bernardino, State of California.

## 21. Termination or Abandonment

- a. City has the right to terminate or abandon any portion or all of the work under this Agreement by giving ten (10) calendar days' written notice to Consultant. In such event, City shall be immediately given title and possession to all original field notes, drawings and specifications, written reports and other documents produced or developed for that portion of the work completed and/or being abandoned. City shall pay Consultant the reasonable value of services rendered for any portion of the work completed prior to termination. If said termination occurs prior to completion of any task for the Project for which a payment request has not been received, the charge for services performed during such task shall be the reasonable value of such services, based on an amount mutually agreed to by City and Consultant of the portion of such task completed but not paid prior to said termination. City shall not be liable for any costs other than the charges or portions thereof which are specified herein. Consultant shall not be entitled to payment for unperformed services, and shall not be entitled to damages or compensation for termination of work.
- b. Consultant may terminate its obligation to provide further services under this Agreement upon thirty (30) calendar days' written notice to City only in the event of substantial failure by City to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement through no fault of Consultant.
- 22. <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. In the event that litigation is brought by any Party in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to recover from the opposing Party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the prevailing Party in the exercise of any of its rights or remedies hereunder or the enforcement of any of the terms, conditions, or provisions hereof. The costs, salary, and expenses of the City Attorney's Office in enforcing this Agreement on behalf of the City shall be considered as "attorneys' fees" for the purposes of this Agreement.
- 23. <u>Responsibility for Errors</u>. Consultant shall be responsible for its work and results under this Agreement. Consultant, when requested, shall furnish clarification and/or explanation as may be required by the City's representative, regarding any services rendered under this Agreement at no additional cost to City. In the event that an error or omission attributable to

Consultant's professional services occurs, Consultant shall, at no cost to City, provide all other services necessary to rectify and correct the matter to the sole satisfaction of the City and to participate in any meeting required with regard to the correction.

- 24. <u>Prohibited Employment</u>. Consultant shall not employ any current employee of City to perform the work under this Agreement while this Agreement is in effect.
- 25. <u>Costs</u>. Each Party shall bear its own costs and fees incurred in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement and in the performance of its obligations hereunder except as expressly provided herein.
- 26. <u>Documents</u>. Except as otherwise provided in "Termination or Abandonment," above, all original field notes, written reports, Drawings and Specifications and other documents, produced or developed for the Project shall, upon payment in full for the services described in this Agreement, be furnished to and become the property of the City.
- 27. <u>Organization</u>. Consultant shall assign Mark Eisen as Project Manager. The Project Manager shall not be removed from the Project or reassigned without the prior written consent of the City. The General Manager of the City of San Bernardino Municipal Water Department shall serve as the City's authorized representative for all purposes under this Agreement.
- 28. <u>Limitation of Agreement</u>. This Agreement is limited to and includes only the work included in the Project described above.
- 29. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice or instrument required to be given or delivered by this Agreement may be given or delivered by depositing the same in any United States Post Office, certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed to the following addresses and shall be effective upon receipt thereof:

- 30. <u>Third Party Rights</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the City and the Consultant.
- 31. <u>Equal Opportunity Employment</u>. Consultant represents that it is an equal opportunity employer and that it shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, age or other interests protected by the State or Federal Constitutions. Such non-discrimination shall include, but not be limited to, all activities related to initial employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination.
- 32. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement, including Exhibit "A," represents the entire understanding of City and Consultant as to those matters contained herein, and supersedes and cancels any prior or contemporaneous oral or written understanding, promises or representations with respect to those matters covered hereunder. Each Party acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements have been made by any person which are not incorporated herein, and that any other agreements shall be void. This is an integrated Agreement.
- 33. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable for any reason, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or of the offending provision in any other circumstance, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 34. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors in interest, executors, administrators and assigns of each Party to this Agreement. However, Consultant shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations without the prior written consent of City. Any attempted assignment without such consent shall be invalid and void.
- 35. <u>Non-Waiver</u>. - 36. <u>Time of Essence</u>. Time is of the essence for each and every provision of this Agreement.
- 37. <u>Headings</u>. Paragraphs and subparagraph headings contained in this Agreement are included solely for convenience and are not intended to modify, explain, or to be a full or accurate description of the content thereof and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.
- 38. <u>Amendments</u>. Only a writing executed by all of the Parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns may amend this Agreement.

- 39. <u>City's Right to Employ Other Consultants</u>. City reserves its right to employ other consultants, including engineers, in connection with this Project or other projects.
- 40. <u>Prohibited Interests</u>. Consultant maintains and warrants that it has neither employed nor retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for Consultant, to solicit or secure this Agreement. Further, Consultant warrants that it has not paid nor has it agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for Consultant, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift or other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, City shall have the right to rescind this Agreement without liability. For the term of this Agreement, no official, officer or employee of City, during the term of his or her service with City, shall have any direct interest in this Agreement, or obtain any present or anticipated material benefit arising therefrom.
- 41. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one single Agreement.
- 42. <u>Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the Parties hereto warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of said Parties and that by doing so, the Parties hereto are formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In 2007, the Department constructed the Verdemont Phase 1 Water Improvements, to provide a water source supply to the 2300 Pressure Zone. These improvements included multiple booster stations, pipelines, and reservoirs to meet the service demand at that time. In 2009, the design for Verdemont Phase 2 was completed to accommodate additional development within the area. The design included a booster pump station and a 4-million-gallon (MG) reservoir. Since then, development has continued at a steady pace. As such, the Department had to complete a redesign of the Verdemont Phase 2 Water Improvements to meet current water demands. On November 14, 2024, the Water Board approved Contract No. 1811 with RE Chaffee Construction, Inc. (RE Chaffee) for the Verdemont 2300 PZ East Water Facilities Project. The project consists of construction of a 1MG steel reservoir, 3500 gallons per minute booster station, and approximately 2900 feet of various sized ductile iron pipe.

Upon excavation the Contractor encountered excess rock which required breaking prior to removal. The breaking of the rock was not anticipated as necessary as such was not included in the original scope of work. The Department and Contractor agreed to share responsibility for the breaking of the excess rock at 50% equally.

The original scope of work for the project did not include re-routing of the surge anticipator line. However, upon excavation Contractor discovered that the line conflicted with an existing manhole. As such, the Contractor had to re-route the anticipator line to avoid the conflict.

Upon the Department's request, the Contractor removed and reinstalled 24' for 24" RCP on a Time and Materials basis. This was necessary to accommodate for the incorrect elevation and slope callout on the plans.

In addition, the Contractor discovered that the elevation of the top of the vault was 3.35' deeper than what was specified on the plans. To correct the elevation difference, the Contractor had to perform additional work to extend the existing vault walls. This work was completed on a time and Materials basis.

Upon the Department's request, the Contractor installed an additional fire hydrant along the access road.

### **BACKGROUND:**

On July 31, 2025, the City of San Bernardino Municipal Water Department will need to renew its property insurance coverage for fiscal year 2025/2026, covering approximately \$532,159,976 in water, wastewater treatment, and sewer collection system real and personal property. The renewal includes earthquake and flood coverage for high priority sites. The annual premium for \$400 million of property coverage, which includes \$10 million in earthquake and flood coverage, has been quoted by Zurich, the Department's current carrier, at \$1,087,817, which is an increase over fiscal year 2024/2025 property coverage of approximately 1.4%. The first excess layer of earthquake and flood coverage offered by Vikco/Lloyds of London provides the same coverage, \$10 million, as last fiscal year's excess coverage policy at a cost of \$155,880. This cost is approximately a 3.6% increase over last year's premium. This increase is due to the increased value in the Department's covered assets. The new administration building and the water reclamation tertiary treatment system were added this year to the asset pool. The second layer of excess coverage for earthquake and flood risks premium cost, provided by Landmark, decreased by 35.2% over last fiscal year's premium. This coverage consists of \$5 million over \$20 million in coverage. This coverage costs are \$52,690. The reduction in premium was due to claim history and expectations of risks that would exceed \$20 million dollars are low. Therefore, total earthquake and flood coverage is set at \$25 million dollars.

Overall, the premiums for property, earthquake and flood insurance for this fiscal year are 0.67% lower than the premiums in fiscal year 2024/2025. There are adequate budgeted funds to cover the costs of these premiums.

Water Department staff continue to work with its insurance broker, Marsh Risk & Insurance Services (Marsh), to find the most appropriate insurance coverage strategy for Department-owned property. Marsh requested coverage quotes from insurers based on the Department's overall asset values and claim history.

The renewing policies offers identical sublimit to fiscal year 2024/2025. The renewing Zurich policy also includes the same characterization of flood hazard areas as the fiscal year 2024/2025 policy. Per Zurich's quote:

"The Flood deductible no longer applies FEMA based Special and Moderate Food Hazard Areas (SFHA and MFHA). Instead the Flood

deductible now applies to property within High or Medium Hazard Zones. The property subject to the High or Medium Hazard Zone deductible will be identified on an appendix attached to the policy. The placement of property within the High or Medium Flood Hazard areas is determined at policy inception based upon the Company's normal flood modeling risk assessment method."

Based on review of the quote, all Water Department property that regularly houses staff is characterized as High Flood Hazard Areas by Zurich. Therefore, the Department's deductible for a flood event affecting these areas would be \$500,000. All other Department property affected by a flood events would carry a \$100,000 deductible with this coverage.

#### **GOAL:**

The request to approve the annual renewal of property, earthquake and flood insurance; and authorize the General Manager to bind all policies effective July 31, 2025; aligns with the Department's 2025 Strategic Plan Goal #5: Ensure Financial Health & Transparency. The acquisition of this insurance coverage will assist the Department's management team in risk-related cost budgeting and aid them in long-term financial planning for all Department's enterprise funds.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

As mentioned previously, funds have been budgeted in fiscal year 2025/2026 to insure \$400,000,000 in property, with \$25,000,000 in earthquake and flood hazard coverage. The funding breakdown is as follows:


