REGIONAL INVESTMENT IN THE CLEAN WATER FACTORY

The City of San Bernardino Municipal Water Department is pleased to announce that the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District is investing in our recycled water project, the Clean Water Factory. The project will provide new and sustainable sources of water for our region. As the region's State Water Project Contractor and Watermaster, Valley District supports the development of additional water supplies in the region.

The Clean Water Factory is a critical component in SBMWD's effort to secure sustainable water supplies able to withstand drought and other challenges, such as increased demand with population growth. Once complete, the Clean Water Factory will capture and recycle up to 5 million gallons of wastewater per day, providing over 5,600 acre-feet of clean water to the San Bernardino Valley.

The recycled water produced will supplement supplies needed for SBMWD's operational use, and will also replenish our local groundwater basin, establishing a new dependable source of water for the region.

Through Valley District's Local Resource Investment Program, SBMWD's Clean Water Factory can receive up to \$970,000 per year for a period of twenty years, beginning in 2021 when the Clean Water Factory becomes operational. Please visit SBMWD.org for more information on the Clean Water Factory.
