




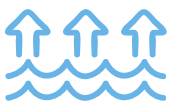
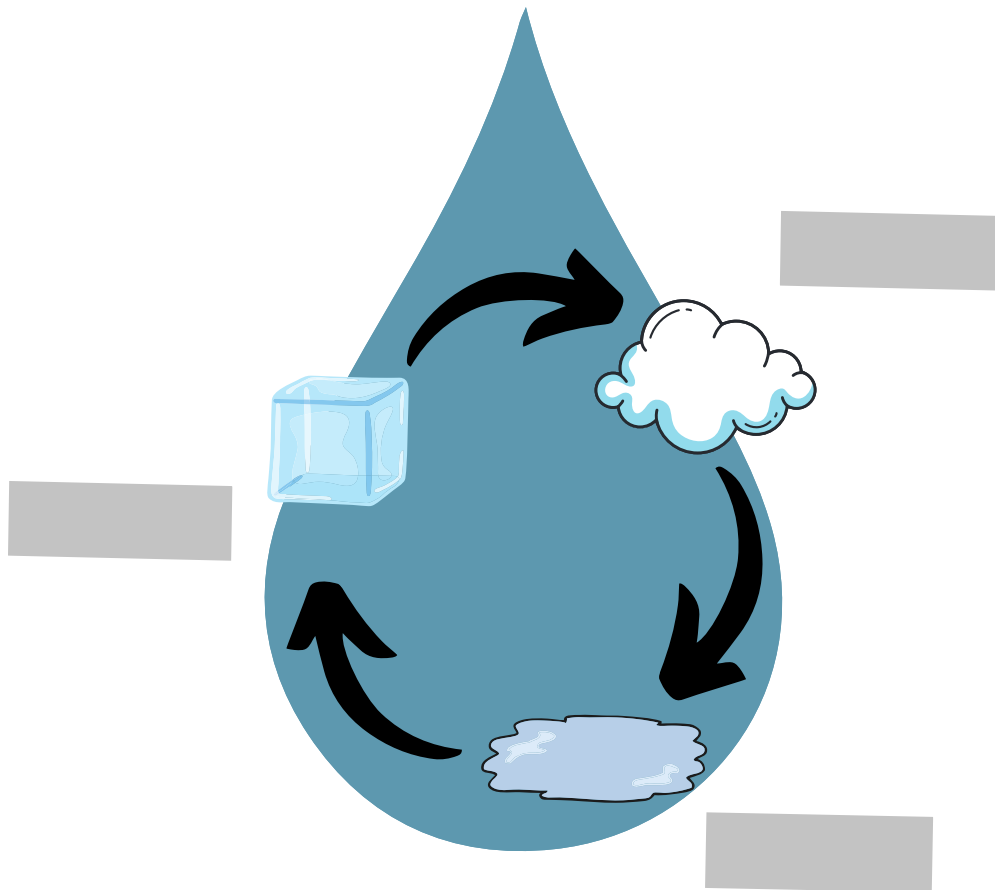

States of Matter



Use the vocabulary terms below to fill in the blanks about the various states of water.



Gas: a substance in a state which will expand freely to fill the whole of a container, having no fixed shape.

- When water reaches 212 degrees Fahrenheit it becomes a gas and is called water vapor. In nature, water vapor forms into clouds through the process of condensation.



Solid: firm and stable in shape; not liquid or fluid.

- When water reaches 32 degrees Fahrenheit it becomes a solid and is usually called ice. In nature, you will see this form as snow, sleet, or hail.



Liquid: a substance that flows freely but is of constant volume, having a consistency like that of water or oil.

- Water is usually a liquid. In nature, you will find water in its liquid form as lakes, rivers, creeks, and streams.
