WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SBMWD

RENOVATIONS AT THE ELECTRIC AVENUE RESERVOIR

The Electric Avenue Reservoir can store up to 8 million gallons of water and plays a critical role in water distribution. The original redwood roof sustained irreparable damage during a high wind event and was replaced in 2019 with a more durable, structurally sound aluminum roof which meets seismic safety standards.

In 2020, the reservoir site received much needed landscape improvements. Newly installed drought tolerant landscaping composed of hardscapes and artificial turf provides a clean aesthetic and conserves thousands of gallons of irrigation water per day!

The Water Department's proud history of service to San Bernardino is also on display through restored components of the original signage from the reservoir's construction in 1937 located just outside of the reservoir.







SBMWD RECOGNIZED FOR EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING

SBMWD has been awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for the fourth year in a row.

AQMD COMPLIANCE THROUGH FUEL CELL TECHNOLOGY

SBMWD is finding innovative ways to implement green technologies to meet environmental standards.

The FuelCell Energy system currently under construction at the Water Reclamation Plant will allow SBMWD to continue to beneficially use digester gas, a byproduct of wastewater treatment, to convert into electricity and heat to fuel water reclamation plant processes.

The energy produced from the fuel cell will come at a lower cost than converting from full cogeneration to full utility power from the electric utility and will help SBMWD meet stringent air quality regulations recently enacted by the South Coast Air Quality Management District.





SBMWD INSTALLS LOW-EMISSIONS EQUIPMENT FOR THE DIGESTER GAS BENEFICIAL USE PROGRAM

The Digester Gas Beneficial Use Program at SBMWD's Water Reclamation Plant produces over 420 cubic feet of digester gas per day. Approximately 70% of the gas produced is used to power cogeneration, engines, pumps, and other wastewater treatment processes, however, the remaining 30% must be combusted safely through a flare tower to meet air quality emissions standards.

The new low-emissions flare pictured here was stored in place at the Water Reclamation Plant in November 2020. The flare stands 50 feet tall and will be an environmentally friendly method to dispose of excess gasses produced in digester tanks which cannot be beneficially reused.
