

SHAPING FUTURE WATER PROFESSIONALS

Committed to providing the next generation of water and wastewater professionals with hands-on experience through local career pathways, SBMWD has launched a new internship program with Arroyo Valley High School.







During the inaugural three-week paid internship this past summer, high school juniors and seniors worked alongside staff from various divisions gaining firsthand insight into daily operations. At the end of the program, students shared their positive feedback and impressions with SBMWD management, school district leaders and regional career educators. Looking forward to the next group of interns this summer!

INNOVATIONS IN ENERGY SAVINGS

The Water Reclamation Plant facilities have been upgraded to improve overall energy efficiency as part of Southern California Edison's (SCE) Statewide Water Infrastructure and System Efficiency (WISE) program.

Designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and optimize the wastewater treatment process, these upgrades enhance control over the secondary treatment process and effluent ammonia levels.

By utilizing advanced technology including nitrate sensors, ammonia analyzers, and automatic control valves, notable reductions were achieved over 12 months resulting in approximately \$290,000 and 2,620,782 kilowatt-hours in cost and energy savings, respectively.



SBWMD received an energy efficiency incentive of \$551,021 from SCE for these improvements which continue to benefit the environment and our community.

HARNESSING THE POWER OF SUSTAINABLE PARTNERSHIPS







A ribbon cutting ceremony in October celebrated the completion of the Waterman Hydroelectric Project which provides innovative energy savings through an ongoing partnership between SBMWD and San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District.

The hydroelectric facility became operational in August and utilizes a Pelton turbine to harness high-pressure water from the State Water Project to generate up to 24,720 kilowatt-hours per day. This is enough energy to power over 400 homes per year! Each agency shared development costs and the result of this collaboration will provide an ongoing benefit to the region for many years.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

The Strategic Plan is an important roadmap which continues to guide the Department through achievable goals and targets. Periodic review and update of the Strategic Plan is done on a regular basis with staff working with the Water Board to ensure SBMWD moves forward efficiently while maintaining trusted, high-quality service to the community.

A workshop was recently held with staff working with Water Board members who provided valuable insight for updating SBMWD's mission, vision, and core values.











COMMITMENT TO ENGAGEMENT

Community engagement is a critical component of the Department's overall mission and values. SBMWD staff actively participates in community events and meetings to share valuable information about important infrastructure improvements, customer programs and services offered and to provide helpful conservation tips.

Throughout the year, SBMWD representatives attend local neighborhood association and community group meetings as well as city and school events to connect, share and learn from community members.
